After completing his internship and residency in orthopaedic surgery at Case Western Reserve University Hospitals in Cleveland, he completed a trauma and spine fellowship at the University of Maryland/ RA Cowley Shock Trauma Hospital and an additional spinal fellowship at Queen's Medical Centre in Nottingham and London England.

Dr. Yue has focused his recent clinical and basic science research in the area of non-fusion spinal technology. He is the lead investigator or principal investigator for a number of FDA IDE studies. He has authored numerous peer reviewed articles and book chapters examining the use total disc arthroplasty in the lumbar and cervical spine. He is a consultant reviewer for several leading spine journals and the lead editor of several spine surgery text books including, *Motion Preservation of the Spine: Advanced Techniques and Controversies, 2008* as well as *The Comprehensive Treatment of the Aging Spine: Minimally Invasive and Advanced Techniques, 2010.* He is a member of the North American Spine Society, the Spine Arthroplasty Society, the World Spine Society, and the AAOS among other national and international organizations.
